

Inter-club Requirements

Receiving Patches and Filing Monthly Reports

2016-2017

1. What is an Inter-club?

*An inter-club meeting is one which is held by two or more Kiwanis clubs (including clubs "in formation") or by a Kiwanis Club and any Builders Club, Circle K Club, Key Club, Aktion Club, and K-Kids Club.**

*The purpose of an inter-club is to develop fellowship and involvement of club members with each other and with members of other K-Family Clubs—to exchange programs and ideas with other clubs, with the mutual benefit of each.***

The inter-club meeting may be a regularly scheduled meeting with two Kiwanis Clubs or a regularly scheduled meeting with a Kiwanis Club plus another K-Family club. The inter-club meeting may also be a conference, convention, rally, service, social, or other activity or project that meets the definition of inter-club meeting as defined by Kiwanis International and meets the PURPOSE of an inter-club as defined by Georgia District of Kiwanis International.

The final decision as to whether a submitted inter-club is accepted as an inter-club will be made by the District Inter-club Committee.

2. Inter-club Attendance Requirements

*Clubs having a membership of twenty (20) or fewer members, a minimum of two (2) members in attendance will be required to constitute an Inter-club meeting. For clubs with a membership of twenty-one (21) to thirty (30) members, a minimum of three (3) members in attendance will be required to constitute an Inter-club meeting. For clubs with a membership of thirty-one (31) or more members, a minimum of four (4) members in attendance will be required to constitute an Inter-club meeting.**

Having an inter-club with more members than the minimum required DOES NOT constitute more than one inter-club.

3. Inter-club Submissions on Club Monthly Report

Each club determines the method for reporting monthly inter-club visits to the club Secretary for inclusion in the club monthly report. The Secretary can add the District Inter-club Chair's email address (dgregg706@aol.com) to the report in order that the Chair is able to retrieve inter-club information.

4. Inter-club Recognition

Banner Patch. Any Kiwanis Club that completes ten (10) inter-clubs will receive a banner patch at the end of the Kiwanis year. The HOST club does not receive inter-club credit for hosting the inter-club.

Club Recognition (based on information received through monthly club reports). The Kiwanis Club(s) accumulating the most inter-club points in a quarter will be recognized as the Inter Club(s) of the Quarter by the Inter-club Committee, will be acknowledged as such in the *Georgia Kiwanian* by the Inter-club Chair and will receive a certificate acknowledging the recognition. Each quarter will begin anew for the accumulating of inter-club points so that all clubs have an equal chance of earning the most points each quarter. The Kiwanis Club (or clubs) that accumulates the most inter-club points for the year will likewise be recognized as the Inter Club(s) of the Year.
